March is here and we are truly enjoying all the bits of sunshine we get out on our play yard. We've been enjoying watching the sheep with their lambs and blowing bubbles as much as possible.

This month there will be an opportunity for you to meet with us for a conference if you choose. It is completely optional, but if you choose to schedule one please be sure to check in with us for a good time to meet.

Lately we have been focusing on helping the children use their verbal language as much as possible by giving them the words to say and encouraging them to speak. One of the ways we do this is by validating any feelings they might be having by saying them out loud with eye contact and bending down to their level.

If your child is moving to the Toddler Program in the Summer or Fall, please attend their Open House on Thursday March 14th at 4:30PM. March is going to be a very busy month for us. We have Open House, Parent Teacher conferences, and Spring Break happening. Along with new work on the shelves.

In preparation for open house, we have a teacher work day. Teacher workday is Monday March 11<sup>th</sup>, no class this day. Open house is on Thursday March 14<sup>th</sup> at 4:30 for the Toddler class and at 5:30 for the Primary class. If your child is attending the Primary Class this Summer or Fall please attend the Primary Program open house.



Parent teacher conferences will be March 19th and 21st. This is a chance for us to connect about your child. You should have already received an email to sign up.

Spring break is the week of March 25<sup>th</sup> through the 29<sup>th</sup>. School is closed during this time.

Starting in March we will have a new work out that is a staple in a Montessori classroom. Our continent map. The continent puzzle map includes all the continents of the world. The children place the pieces on a control chart using fine motor skills by holding the little knob and placing it on the correct spot on the control chart. This is the first puzzle map introduced in a Montessori classroom. The Primary class has each continent in which each country is represented by a separate puzzle piece. Finally, there is a map of the United States with each individual state. Throughout the growth and development of the child in the Montessori class, the child will work with the maps and later usually in the kindergarten year a child will trace, label and paint the map all be themselves. It is exciting watching a child's development through the years using the maps. It also creates discussion and inquiry of our world.

## **Primary Corner:**

#### **Dear Families,**

Such a busy month we had in February. From Maddie, the red-tailed hawk, visiting our class to celebrating the Lunar New Year with a dragon parade, our students certainly enjoyed all the activities and festivities. Art projects included our large dragons, dragon crowns, lanterns, cherry blossom pictures, and learning about Japanese artist, Yayoi Kusama. Special thanks to Lucie for enriching our cultural curriculum with food and cooking experiences. Our young chefs created dumplings, sushi, and rice balls! Just about everyone asked for more!

**Cultural curriculum: Continent study:** We are headed to **Europe** this month with a focus on three countries: England, Italy, and Sweden. Social studies lessons emphasize awareness and respect for the different cultures worldwide, people, places, and customs. **Zoology:** Amphibians! With all this rain we are looking forward to having some tadpoles in our class so we can observe and learn about the life cycle of the frog. **Botany:** Fruits. Last month we tasted dragon fruit. Movement & Dance party songs: Fox's Dance, Skip to My Lou, A Tree Fell Down, Raccoon and Possum, The Chicken Dance, Seven Jumps, Rig a Jig-Jig.

One example of a dance party: On Valentine's Day we used scarves and ribbons while dancing to The Beatles, *All You Need is Love*. Every time we heard the word "love" we tossed our ribbons and scarves into the air.
