Primary Corner:




Dear Parents,

As part of our Botany curriculum we continue to explore the different parts of the plant we eat: Roots, stems, leaves, flowers, fruits, and seeds. The rich sensory experience is very exciting for the children, and we invite you to include this concept into your kitchen at home.

By now the students have had much exposure to their written names and its beginning sound. This language skill takes place daily and we expand this practice to a more

versatile vocabulary: Athena, Albert, Augie, August, apple, astronaut, alligator, antler, etc. Sometimes we turn this type of learning into a game for the whole group, and plenty of peers generously offer names and words from their home lives.

Sensorial and math is our focus on Wednesdays and while we focus on more of the basics in the morning we dive deeper with older students in the afternoon. Linear counting and skip counting, place value of the decimal system, and fractions all have been introduced and practiced repeatedly. In how many ways can we build any given number opens doors for addition and multiplication. Division is fun because 'We share equally' and everyone appreciates fairness.



Playing the bells has been a great addition for the classrooms. They SING to us and we sing back to them. Matching up a sound and listening to a higher or lower frequency takes precise attention. We are just getting started and it is fun!

Now we begin to learn about our continent of North America. We get out many animal figurines and study different habitats. What animals do we see in our neighborhoods and who is roaming the streets and forests at night? Timing has it that we now connect with friends and families for celebrations and we are filled with gratitude. November is important for building and sharing memories and traditions.

We are looking forward to learning more about your child, family, and your values during our conferences.
