Sign-In Sheets

Please be sure to sign your child **IN** and **OUT** each day. The sign in sheets are a legal document that requires an adults full legal signature. **We ask that only grown-ups write on the sign in sheets.**



School Wide Reminders:

Sunscreen: Please apply sunscreen to your child(ren) before coming to school. We re-apply in the afternoons. If you have a specific sunscreen that you would like for us to use for your child, please send some to school clearly labeled with their name.

Labels: Please label every item that comes to school with your child. For example clothing, jackets, hats, lunch boxes, water bottles should all have your child's name clearly written on them.

Parking Lot: Please drive slowly in the parking lot! And be sure to hold your child's hand while walking to and from the school.

Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures

Primary Students: Please drop off your child at the front door between 8 and 8:30am. You will be greeted by a teacher or staff member who will walk your child down the hall and help them to find their cubby. If you pick up at 11:45AM or 2PM, please wait at the front door for your child. If you pick up between 3-4PM, please walk down the main hall to the play yard to collect your child.

Toddler Students: Please enter the Toddler Classroom via the Toddler Side Yard with your child. Help them to find their cubby and place their lunch inside. Then please drop them off with their teachers in the toddler yard. Pick up at 12PM and 4PM are from the Toddler Yard.

Infant Students: Please walk your child down the main hall to the Infant Classroom. You will be greeted by a teacher who will help put away your child's things in their cubby. Pick up at 12PM and 4PM is the same.

Overtime Charge: Children that remain more than 6 minutes after school closes (4PM) will be charged a late fee of \$6 plus \$1 per minute for each additional minute thereafter. For children who are registered to stay until 5PM the same guidelines apply. A late fee of \$6 will be charged for children picked up after 5:06PM and \$1 per minute thereafter. Please note that you must be registered for the extended hour in order to stay until 5PM. Due to ratio restrictions we cannot accommodate drop-ins. Thank you for your cooperation!

If you have a specific brand you prefer for your child, feel free to leave some with us at school. If clothes go home wet or dirty, please replenish your child's stash of clean extra clothes.

When you drop off your child please place their items in their cubby or on their hooks when you enter the room. Any information about what they have happening in their life, how they are sleeping, food related issues or anything else they may have going on is very helpful with a brief exchange in the morning. A quick and consistent goodbye with your child is most effective in the long term as they acclimate to their new routine.

Toddler Corner:

Welcome to our Toddler Class at Montessori School of Sonoma. We are very excited and happy to begin a new school year. Here are a few details and suggestions that will facilitate a smooth start.

- **Diapers Please No Pull Ups:** If your child wears diapers, please bring a package on the first day of school. These will be kept in our Toddler bathroom on a shelf with your child's name on it. We will request more as needed.
- Extra Clothes: Please bring a full set of clothes for your child. Each child is provided a bag in our class for their extra clothes. Please be sure to label each item.
- Name: Please clearly put your child's name on their lunchbox, water bottle, sweaters, jackets, hats, etc. Please help us keep your child's things with your child by labeling every item that comes to school. We have 12 children each day to care for, and it's easy for items to get mixed together in the daily shuffle of school!

Each morning we ask your child to put their water on our umbrella table and their lunch in their cubby. It is sometimes difficult for a parent to separate from their child, just as it may be for the child to separate from their parent. Please help your child with their tasks and then say a quick goodbye. As the year progresses you will be able to say goodbye at the gate and your child will take care of their own tasks. If your child cries, let them know that you understand how they feel and that you'll be back soon. Leave without hesitating. Children usually will not continue to cry for more than a few minutes. If there is a problem, we will call you.

The classroom is a community and the ground rules are introduced to keep order, clarify expectations, give the child limits/boundaries and keep everyone safe. The ground rules such as walking, carrying an activity with two hands, rolling up a rug, pushing in chairs, cleaning up after oneself, not disturbing others while working, help provide order, cleanliness, and a safe place to be. The child is able to move freely, which as Maria Montessori says, allows for independence, coordination, order and concentration which leads to a high selfesteem and self-confidence; as well as, self-control and patience. Finally the ground rules teach social responsibility in that we do not do anything that hurts ourselves, others, or the environment.

Our indoor class time begins at 9:00 and our morning outdoor time is devoted to social play and physical activity. We have observed that children who arrive by 8:30 have an easier time transitioning to school, visiting with friends and teachers, and playing!

Curriculum Spotlight: Building Community through Grace and Courtesy Lessons.

"Montessori classrooms are designed to support the development of independence and responsibility in students. This is achieved through a variety of practices, such as allowing students to choose their own work, encouraging them to take care of their own needs (such as getting a snack or using the bathroom), and providing opportunities for them to contribute to the classroom community (such as cleaning up after themselves or helping younger students). By fostering independence and responsibility, students learn to take ownership of their actions and develop a sense of pride in their accomplishments. Grace and Courtesy lessons help build a strong sense of community within the classroom, as students learn to work together and support one another." (from Trillium Montessori)

Clothes and dressing

It is important that your child comes to school in clothes and shoes that are comfortable, easy to manage, and conducive to active movement. Your child may need to change their clothes during the day (Accidents happen! Please supply extra clothes!) We encourage independence and will let your child change him/her self. Please support this practice at home and allow your child to dress so he/she is confident and successful at school. Please only send your child in shoes with laces if they are able to tie them.

Sharing Day is on Thursdays

Your child is welcome to bring one item for sharing. Books, crafts, pictures, photos, and nature treasures are welcome. Toys are best left at home. There is a basket outside our classroom for sharing items.
