So many learning experiences are happening in the primary classroom!

One of the best parts of our **curriculum studies** this past year has been all the continent maps our students have completed. We've hung many of the maps in the hallway for everyone to enjoy and admire. Our students have worked hard tracing, coloring, painting, and labelling the various continents. Some are meticulously detailed and others are more concept oriented with an artistic interpretation.



**Fishes and Frogs and Butterflies, oh my!** For all our future biologists, scientists, and entomologists we've had plenty to learn through first hand experience in the observation and research of various life cycles. The tanks and habitats are observed daily. The discussions among the children are genuinely rich and meaningful.



We've had some tadpoles visiting at various times throughout this past month. Some wee ones and others with their back legs already developing.

Five caterpillars arrived in the mail. We've sung to them each day and remarked how much they have grown. We are anxiously waiting for the butterflies to emerge from the chrysalises.

We placed fifty steelhead trout in our very cold 10 gallon tank. We've been checking the tank daily to see how they are growing. From the eggs to the alevins to the little fry, it has been exciting to see the fish develop and grow.

And first thing in the morning, counting the mosquitoes that emerged overnight has also been popular. As of press time the count was 11!
